

Italy's and France's remittances



The graph expresses the values of the remittances of Italy and France, in millions of dollars, in three years (2000,2005,2009).


The years are shown on the x-axis; the millions of dollars are shown on the y-axis. In France the remittances are larger than in Italy, probably because more French than Italian workers emigrate.

The peak value of Italy is recorded in 2005 and it is 2,397 million dollars; the peak value of France is recorded in 2009 and corresponds to 15,257 million dollars. However, it is costantly increasing.

Average Remittances in Italy

From the graph trend we may predict that the average remittances in Italy will decrease as time goes by. In fact the graph trend shows that after a period of growth, with a peak in 2005, the remittances have begun to decrease.

GDP percentage of remittances in 2009



The graph describes the percentage of average remittances with a vertical bar graph. On the X-axis there are the countries. On the Y-axis there are the GDP (Gross Domestic Product) percentages for every nation.

Eastern European countries and North African countries have got the highest percentages of remittances, except Algeria.

Italy and France have the lowest GDP percentage of remittances. We should notice that a lot of Lebanese, for example, emigrate and send a part of their salary to their families.
